

Regional junior Tour (RJT)



Golf Québec has implemented a competition structure that offers junior golfers of all ages and skills levels the opportunity to access appropriate and tailored competition tours. Within its competition structure, Golf Québec organizes events through the following three competition tours:

- Introduction to Competition Tour (IT)
- Regional Junior Tour (JRT)
- Provincial Junior Tour (PJT)

The RJT events are organized and run regionally by volunteers of the regional associations. Golf Québec oversees and supports these initiatives.

In this tour, the competitive aspect and performances are starting to take on more importance. It is a stepping-stone to the PJT. It facilitates the selection of the best athletes from each region for the Provincial Junior Championships and other major championships, as well as earning points on the provincial ODM. Pee-wee, bantam, juvenile and junior categories are represented in these events with adapted yardage for each category. Awards and performance recognition by age and gender encourage athletes of all abilities to participate in these competitions.

The events are spread out in the summer calendar to provide competitive opportunities over a longer period, which helps prepare athletes for each tournament. The proximity of the competitions is also an undeniable advantage as they are held in the participants' region. Categories and yardages

- 18-hole tournaments (minimum of 4 events per region)
- Target categories: junior, juvenile, bantam, pee-wee (boys - girls)

Categories	Girls	Boys
Junior / Juvenile	5,400 yards	6,300 yards
Bantam	5,100 yards	5,800 yards
Pee-wee	4,700 yards	5,400 yards

Please note that all the above yardages are approximate and should be used as a guide when referees/regional representatives are setting up the field.

REGIONAL AND PROVINCIAL ORDERS OF MERIT

Players who take part in the RJT events can cumulate points both on the regional and provincial Orders of Merit. Altogether, here is what these OOM are used for:

→ Regional OOM: it's not mandatory for a region to maintain an OOM.

- Determine the best players of each category during the golf season.
- Selection tool for the Inter-Regional Championship.

→ Provincial OOM:

- A players must participate in a minimum of 3 rounds of the RJT in order to cumulate points on the provincial OOM;
- The following categories can earn points on the provincial OOM (for boys and girls): global, junior, juvenile, bantam, and pee-wee (please refer to the OOM page on the Golf Québec website).

EQUIVALENCE

In some cases, players could miss a RJT even because they are already playing in another tournament, at a superior level. In such case, a differential of the round that was actually played (in the superior tournament) will be added in the differential chart of the regional association where the player is affiliated.
